PALCARE - 10 Years of Caring!

A cancer diagnosis brings a profound emotional and physical burden - not only for patients, but also for their loved ones. The disease itself, along with the side effects of treatment, can significantly diminish a patient's quality of life. In such circumstances, effective, evidence-based, pain and symptom management, delivered with compassion and emotional support, becomes essential to help patients feel whole again and regain lost confidence.



When PALCARE launched its service in December 2015, the founding team were driven by a singular purpose – easy access to state-of-the-art palliative care across Mumbai for citizens who are diagnosed with chronic, life limiting and debilitating conditions, particularly cancer, so that they may be relieved of excruciating and incapacitating symptoms, leading to a better quality of life and dignity in death.

At that time there was only one 'home based' palliative care network in the city of Mumbai, and that was the Tata Memorial Hospital (TMH), which launched its service in 1997, but which limits its care to only those patients who are on treatment at TMH. While Shanti Avedna Sadan, also in Mumbai, had been around for more than 28 years, since 1986, it is a hospice without a home-care facility.



Our entry into this sector in Mumbai triggered a widespread, much-needed, expansion of palliative care services across this part of the country and we are deeply humbled to have played a pioneering role in transforming Mumbai's palliative care landscape. In 2015, the term "palliative care" frequently drew quizzical looks from laypeople and medical professionals alike. Ten years later, with the proliferation of palliative care services in Mumbai, spurred by the success of the PALCARE service, many more doctors, specialists, family physicians and well-read laypersons, are aware of the meaning of palliative care.

PALCARE's commitment to continuous, comprehensive training for its multidisciplinary teams is reflected in the high-quality care delivered to patients. This is evident when one compares the percentage of referrals that PALCARE received from sources other than Tata Memorial Hospital in FY 2015-16 and 2016-17 versus those received in 2025-26. We are, however, extremely grateful to TMH for providing us the springboard to enter this space.

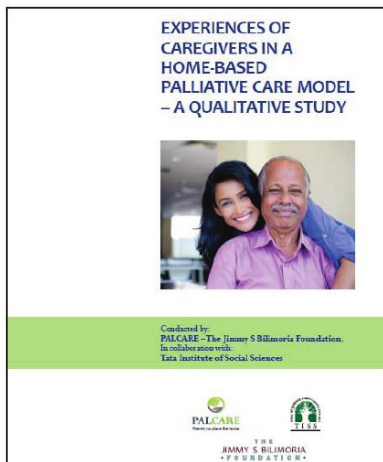

In 2019, following in the footsteps of CanSupport (2006) & Pallium India (2008), PALCARE launched comprehensive palliative care guidelines for home based palliative care and made these guidelines



universally available online through the PALCARE official website. The PALCARE benchmarks have seen widespread industry praise and adoption, demonstrating PALCARE's ability to play a leadership role.

In 2019, PALCARE also achieved a significant milestone in research. It partnered with the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) to publish a qualitative study on the core challenges & coping mechanisms of active caregivers in a home setting for palliative care. The study captured vital insights into the support systems needed for both patients & their families. These findings were published in the Indian Journal of Palliative Care's July - September 2020 edition.



Post Covid 19, PALCARE mastered the art of providing a hybrid service of physical visits plus telephonic visits – in order that patients receive timely response from the team and do not suffer.

In September 2023, PALCARE introduced a digital platform, to capture and store patient data. The digital app facilitates zonal teams to retrieve vital records faster and easier, for better management of patients' conditions.



In April 2025, PALCARE was featured in eHospice (UK) – a global platform for hospice and palliative care news. This international validation serves as a powerful testament to the quality of our clinical standards that we painstakingly continue to strive to take to the next level.

In 10 years, PALCARE grew from one team to nine zonal teams, reaching underserved communities across the Mumbai Metropolitan area. In the early years each zonal team looked after around 15 to 20 patients per zone. 10 years later each zonal team looks after 45 to 50 patients (occasionally up to 55) while successfully maintaining our passion for high quality palliative care. At any given time, PALCARE, has 350 plus patients in its care, and over 1000 in FY 2025-26.

Unlike other facilities, which hire medical social workers and even lay volunteers for counselling in palliative care, PALCARE was amongst the first in Mumbai to hire trained psychologists for the critical counselling role.

In my country, (Denmark), Palliative care is easily accessible to anyone who needs it, but I did not expect that Palliative care would be available in India. And then to find a service like yours! I will not forget you'll till the day I die. ~ PALCARE patient s brother, Worli, Mumbai. (2017)

Sharing of Clinical Knowledge and Capacity Building:



- In 2024 & 2025, PALCARE conducted online lectures “An Introduction to Palliative Care,” as part of the Psycho-Oncology Training Workshops organized by the Cancer Patients Aid Association (CPAA) & South Indian Education Society (SIES) College of Arts, Science, & Commerce.

- In early 2026, PALCARE was appointed by the Government of Maharashtra to deliver lectures to around 240 Taluka Health Officers across the state of Maharashtra to empower them to take palliative care forward to all government medical institutions.
- In 2025 - 2026 PALCARE initiated community efforts to create awareness for palliative care amongst the marginalised sections of society in Dharavi, Prabhadevi, Chinchpokli and Arthur Road.
- With the introduction of a “Ration Scheme” in 2022 and “Compassionate Financial Assistance” programme in 2026, PALCARE extended support to economically disadvantaged patients for basic food, medicines, investigations & essential needs.

- Strengthen internal communication: Foster closer collaboration and stronger relationships within zonal teams, for a more cohesive and superior service at all times.

- Target critical care: Prioritise cancer and advanced-stage, chronically ill, patients.

- **Community Integration & Advocacy**

- Forge healthcare partnerships: Collaborate with medical institutions to expand palliative care across the region. Enlighten GPs, students, & government health workers to drive awareness.



- **Seminal Research**

- Spearhead clinical studies: Drive groundbreaking research into clinical and psychosocial care.
- Publish impactful literature: Generate actionable insights to advance the broader palliative care community.

A key highlight was a landmark conference held on 10th December at the National Centre for the Performing Arts (NCPA) supported by The Mahindra Foundation & The Reliance Foundation.

- **Chief Guest Dr. Farokh Udwadia** - renowned physician, author, Padma Bhushan awardee, and palliative care advocate - shared reflections on the evolving practice of medicine and the need for greater humanity and compassion in clinical care.
- This was followed by keynote addresses from **Dr. James Tulsky and Dr. Mark Stoltenberg**, who highlighted North American and global best practices in symptom management and psychosocial support and offered insights particularly relevant to the Indian context.
- Dr. Jayita Deodhar, Head of the Department of Palliative Medicine at Tata Memorial Hospital, chaired a panel comprising Ms. Harmala Gupta, Founder of CanSupport, Dr. Rajam Iyer, a leading pulmonologist and palliative care physician and Ms. Devaunshi Mehta, Director Psychosocial Care at PALCARE. The discussion focused on India's growing demand for palliative and mental health care and identifying sustainable solutions.

Our Activities - FY 2025-26

PALCARE continued to demonstrate steady progress, as evidenced by the outcomes it achieved:

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Internal Meetings:

- Each Thursday, PALCARE's nine teams convened virtually on Zoom to share important updates - covering new patient enrolments, high-priority cases, discharges, and deaths. These meetings enabled a valuable exchange of knowledge and insights, as participants recounted their clinical experiences and discussed any challenges they encountered.
- Internal Lectures: In the last fiscal year, PALCARE held the following lectures:
 - Guest Lectures (11)
 - Lectures aimed primarily at doctors (8)
 - Lectures aimed primarily at nurses (5)
 - Lectures aimed primarily at counsellors (6)
 - General Lectures (4) & Journal Club (2)

External Training

- From 26 - 27 April 2025, five PALCARE Counsellors participated in "An experiential workshop in narrative therapy" held by Dr. Danielle Pereira of Chronicle at the Holy Family Hospital, Bandra, Mumbai.
- On 12 - 14 August 2025, a physician and three nurses from PALCARE attended the "Basics in Pediatric Palliative Care" training program held by Tata Memorial Hospital.



- July - December 2025: Two of PALCARE's psychologists completed the "Certificate Course in Counselling Skills in Cancer and Palliative Care": A Blended Learning Program held by the Bangalore Hospice Trust, Karunashraya, Bengaluru in conjunction with the Kasturba Medical College, Manipal.

- January – December 2025: Dr. Amanjeet Kaur successfully completed PALLIUM INDIA's one-year Global Fellowship in Palliative Medicine program graduating with an A+.
- 23 - 25 February 2026: One of PALCARE's psychologist attended a National Level Workshop on 'Childhood Trauma & Psychosocial Disability: Early Identification, Therapeutic Interventions and Long-Term Rehabilitation', which was organized by TISS in collaboration with the Indian Association of Health, Research, and Welfare.
- 16 March - 06 May 2026: Three of PALCARE's doctors, five nurses, and two counsellors have completed Pallium India's Foundation Course in Palliative Care .

Knowledge Sharing & Capacity Building

- On 10 April, 22 May, 10 July, 18 September, 30 October, and 4 December 2025, a PALCARE Counsellor delivered online lectures on "An Introduction to Palliative Care" to psychology students (around twenty each time) as part of the Psycho-Oncology Training Workshop organized by the Cancer Patients Aid Association (CPAA). A PALCARE Counsellor delivered the same lecture in person to around 20 psychology students at the SIES College of Arts, Science, and Commerce in March 2026.

- 29–30 January 2026: On being invited by the Government of Maharashtra to be a faculty of the "Training of Trainers (TOT) National Programme for Palliative Care (NPPC)," PALCARE sent its Senior Physician, Dr. Pranjal Ramugade and Sr. Ankita Mhatre to the State Institute of Health & Family Welfare, Nagpur, to educate 40 Medical Officers from the Public Health Department, Maharashtra.



- 12 February 2026: As part of the same Training of Trainers (TOT) National Programme for Palliative Care, a senior doctor delivered an online presentation on 'Home-Based Palliative Care: Nursing Care for Home Care patients and Educating Family Members' to around 240 Taluka Health Officers in Maharashtra.

Palliative Care Awareness & Outreach

- 22 April 2025, PALCARE initiated community engagement efforts in Dharavi. Meeting with the ASHA leadership from Chinchpokli & Arthur Road, helped establish strong connections.
- 8 May 2025, the team visited an Anganwadi centre in Prabhadevi. Engaged with Balwadi workers, who expressed willingness to help identify & refer patients.
- 25 September 2025, PALCARE participated in the *Swasth Nari Sashakti Parivar Abhiyan* under the National Health Mission, engaging with approximately 15 doctors, 25 ASHA workers, and over 50 patients.
- 29 September 2025, PALCARE participated in the *BMC-Arogya Camp at Andheri East*. Engaging with healthcare providers & community workers, PALCARE distributed informational material & generated patient referrals.
- 19 January 2026, PALCARE conducted an awareness session for members of the Mahila Parishad (aged 50+) affiliated with the All-India Women's Conference. The session covered the scope of palliative care, cancer awareness early detection and self-examination techniques, while emphasizing the holistic role of palliative care.



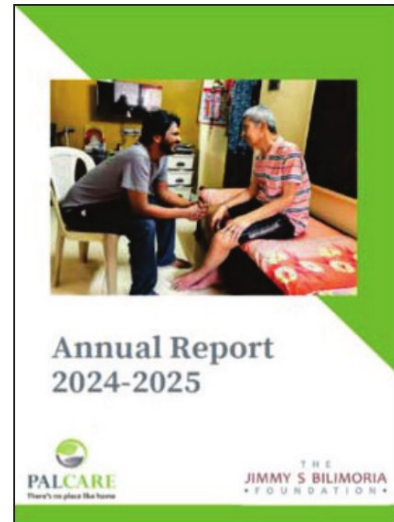
IAPCON 2026:

Communications & Outreach

- In April 2025, PALCARE disseminated its Annual Digital Newsletter for 2024–25 to a targeted audience of 442 recipients. This included 200 oncologists, 100 non-oncologists, 21 trustees and board members, 48 donor trusts, 40 corporate donors, and 33 grantors.
- In August 2025, PALCARE distributed its Annual Report for FY 2024–25 to 1,260 recipients, including oncologists, medical specialists, general physicians, grantors and donors.
- Remembrance Day 2025: To honor the memory of those patients who passed away in the last year, PALCARE mailed out diyas to each of the 490 families who lost a loved one in 2025.

The Medical Team

The Medical team is the heartbeat of the organization. They bring the care to the patient's home and make sure that incapacitating and devastating symptoms are brought under control at the earliest, and the patient's and family's psychosocial needs are taken care of.

PALCARE has recently instituted a Clinical Leadership Team comprising senior mentors of staff who are in charge of directing PALCARE's medical programme on a day-to-day basis.

They provide clear direction to the Medical Team to deliver a high-quality service aligned with PALCARE's guiding principles of Quality Care, Professionalism, and the provision of the finest medical care plans, ensuring that all beneficiaries are treated with dignity, compassion, and respect at all times. They include:

The Medical Team is divided into 9 Zonal teams who cover the length and breadth of the Mumbai Metropolitan region. Each Zonal team comprises one doctor, two nurses, one counsellor. There are 8 Support staff to handle Administration, Finance and Accounts, Data collection and Analysis and manage the Ration Scheme and other programmes.

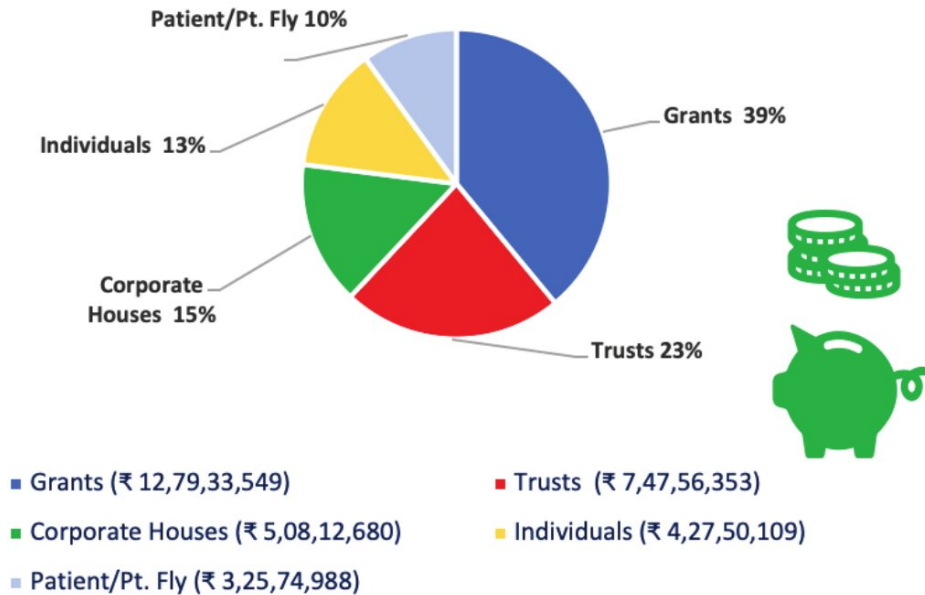

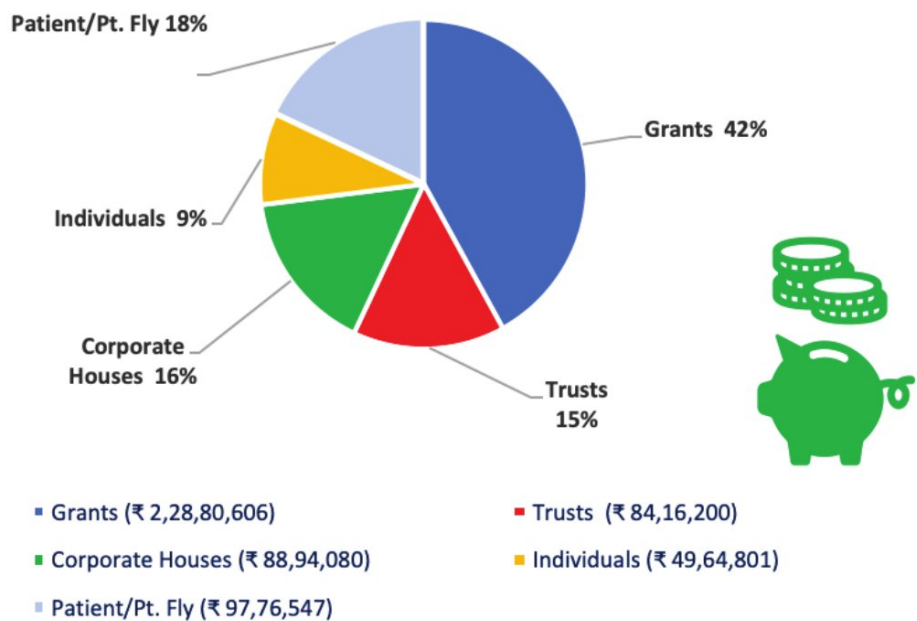
